YDF vs. Selby, Round ???

It seems this fight over the clubhouse with Youth Development Foundation is starting to go in circles! In October, YDF filed a preliminary injunction in the Circuit Court requesting that we obtain YDF's permission to use the clubhouse every time we want to use it, regardless of the reason. (Our lawsuit against them started with a preliminary injunction in the Circuit Court.) They contend that we are using the clubhouse for reasons that do not qualify for 'beach and park' use (as stated in the most recent ruling in our favor) and that they are unable to make any use of the building for themselves. Our attorney has filed a response to their arguments. The Courts have granted us "free and unobstructed use" of the building, so it would seem that they have no basis for their request. If granted, the injunction would be in effect until a final ruling is made on our current lawsuit, which YDF is attempting to appeal to the Maryland Court of Appeals. We do not know when, or if, the Circuit Court will file a hearing date for their preliminary injunction.

We are also still waiting to find out whether the Maryland Court of Appeals will hear YDF's appeal of the Court of Special Appeal's ruling made last August.

Oyster Reef Established in Selby Bay

Selby Bay has a new oyster reef, thanks to the South River Federation (SRF), the Department of Natural Resources, the Chesapeake Bay Foundation and others! In October 2002, approximately five hundred thousand baby oysters were planted on the one-acre reef, which is located off our beach and Selby Yacht Basin. If you stand on our boat ramp pier and look straight out and slightly to the left, the reef is marked by small yellow buoys between the red channel marker and Long Point (the marshy area directly across Selby Bay from our beach). The oysters in this reef will help filter the water in Selby Bay. Hopefully, this will be the start of a healthier Selby Bay and South River!
